Key responsibilities and expectations for all CORE and Student Leaders include:

1. a relationship with Christ and a commitment to represent Him well in all aspects of life (home, church, campus...)
2. regular attendance and participation at Bayside Church and at theBridge programs
3. regular prayer for Bayside Church and for theBridge staff, leadership, and students

The CORE: Champions for theBridge Ministry... Student Leaders that lead their peers. Commitment includes bi-monthly Sunday afternoon meetings

Student Leaders: Belong to one of the 5 Ministry teams... They report to the CORE leaders and are required to attend bi-monthly Sunday afternoon meetings as well as work on the team responsibilities.

Ministry Team Breakdown

Outreach Team

This team is responsible for deciding on, planning and organizing all aspects of theBridge's Outreach efforts. This includes, but is not limited to, Gratitude Project (Nov), Christmas Project (Dec), Mexico Outreach (Easter Week), etc. The ultimate goal is to provide opportunities for theBridge to serve others and share the love of Christ with the lost.

Program Team

The program team works alongside the staff to plan and implement weekly programs (theBridge and theAM) i.e. student led nights, praise and prayer nights, student testimonies and opportunities to serve in program roles, and more. This team needs student leaders for all program aspects including tech (sound/video/lighting), web, promotion, announcements, creative ideas and input on series and direction of the ministry.

Hospitality Team

From stepping into a weekly service or an event sponsored by theBridge, this team works hard to make sure that ALL students feel welcomed, accepted, and included. They ensure theBridge is set up in such a way that communicates excellence and intentional effort. This team is responsible for recruiting and training greeters, ushers, and décor teams as well as plans for welcoming new students, following up new students and distributing welcome boxes and promo material. This team will also work closely with staff for theBridgeConnect once a month.

Events Team

All year long theBridge sponsors events for high school students. We do everything from bowling nights to sleepovers, 80's dance to summer camp, and more... What can we dream up? The events team works on planning and pulling off special events that are designed to draw more students to theBridge, as well as provide opportunities for theBridge community to have fun and be together. This team needs folks who like to throw parties, organize, work with details, etc.

Campus Team

There are hundreds of active participants in theBridge's weekly programs and special events. We want to see theBridge grow spiritually as well as numerically. We want to be a place that draws students from the Bayside campus as well as from our schools. This team will work on reaching out to existing students at theBridge as well as recruiting others from their campuses and from within the Bayside Church Family. The responsibilities include assisting in deciding small group curriculum, working on campus relations, having a Bridge presence in schools, following up with students who have visited theBridge, and more as the team develops.
