WHY MEXICO?

Bayside has been crossing the border and God has been transforming lives for 30 years. During Easter week, students and adults come together to serve as the hands and feet of Jesus across the Mexicali valley. Our church started this trip in 1996 with a group of 26 and has grown to over 1000+ because of the positive and lasting impact on the Mexican community and on the Americans that go.

The large group is divided into smaller teams that serve our partner churches and organizations. An average alfalfa field in a rural farming town is turned into a small city of green army tents. We begin each day with time in God's word, worship, and prayer before going out to our various ministry locations. After a full day of serving our hearts out, we return to camp for good food, worship under the stars, and a powerful Biblical message.

Now, more than ever, our simple act of showing up will bring encouragement and support to our brothers and sisters in Mexico. We learn so much from them as we see how they advance the Gospel in their communities with limited means, and we serve alongside them to shine the light and love of Christ!

This annual trip to Mexico relies on the collaboration of adults and high school students who come together to help grow the kingdom. The outreach in Mexico creates multiple levels of impact. However, as amazing as it is to serve, another beautiful aspect of this trip is the work that happens in the students' hearts during morning and evening chapel. They hear two messages a day taught by our high school and campus pastors, are led in worship, have moments for small group discussions, and find space to read their Bibles. We believe this time is just as impactful as it is being part of a serving team.

If you do not upload a copy of your passport at the time of registration, you **MUST** submit a copy to the registrar by March 16, 2025.

Mexico Cost Breakdown

Early Bird Registration

(Oct 1 - Nov 30)

- \$99 Early Bird Deposit due at the time of registration
- \$750 fundraising amount required

Total Cost: \$849

Regular Registration

(Dec 1 - Jan 31)

- \$149 deposit due at the time of registration
- \$750 fundraising amount required

Total Cost: \$899

Driver Discount (25 years of age and older)

- \$400 Discount for Approved Drivers

To qualify for the \$400 discount, you must be willing to drive students or other Mexico participants. This amount will be deducted from your fundraising goal once your driver's license has been submitted and you have been approved.

Total Cost: \$499

Interpreters

- Fluent in Spanish
- 18+ (High school students are not eligible)
- \$149 deposit is required at the time of registration
- \$750 discount will be applied when approved

Total cost: \$149

- \$99 if you register during the Early Bird registration period

Creative Fundraising Tips

When raising money we recommend to trust God as your provider and seek Him for a strategy ALWAYS. We give all high school students and adults the opportunity to fundraise for their trip to Mexico. After attempting to fundraise, if you need a scholarship, please contact your high school pastor.

1 Reach out personally via phone, in person, email, or text to share your fundraising link and connect with potential donors who resonate with your trip. If you ask 30 people for \$30 each, you'll be fully funded for Mexico! Sharing your story and the impact of your trip encourages them to support you.

2 Here are some creative ways to raise money for your trip: bake sales, dog walking, social media posts, yard sales, house sitting, babysitting, and more! We encourage you to get creative and take action to fund this mission trip

A

Team Leader

Each Team Leader brings significant experience with Bayside Mexico Outreach and Student Ministries at Bayside. They have demonstrated the ability to communicate clearly, maintain a positive attitude, exhibit maturity, build healthy relationships, and execute Bayside's plans and directives. Team Leaders are responsible for providing oversight at ministry sites and ensuring that students adhere to the safety measures agreed upon during training.

Assistant Leader

Assistant Leaders provide leadership support to the team leaders. Assistant Adult Leaders must also have proven themselves in their ability to communicate clearly, maintain positive attitude, carry themselves with maturity, build healthy relationships and execute on the plans and directives of Bayside.

HS

Student Leader

Student Leaders are responsible for casting vision to the team and directing ministry on a daily basis. They should develop their teams spiritually and hold them accountable to growth opportunities. They are expected to help their peers process through their trip as it progresses. Student Leaders should be confident and ready to vocally direct a large group of students in the right direction. Student Leaders are accountable to student ministry pastors, staff and the Team Leader.
